Dates and location: the Two Shores Youth Scheme consist of two seminars:

April 28 to May 2 - Rabat (Morocco).

June 23 to 27 - Mallorca (Spain).

Costs: This seminar is organized by the FMES Institute with the support of the French Ministry of Europe and Foreign Affairs and European organizations.

For northern countries (Portugal, Spain, France, Italy, Malta), accommodation and lunches are provided.

Audience

The scheme is made up of twenty young auditors, eager to deepen their knowledge of geostrategy and geopolitics, to better understand the interactions between the two shores of the Mediterranean.

Two auditors per member country (Portugal, Spain, France, Italy, Malta, Libya, Tunisia, Algeria, Morocco, Mauritania) form the scheme: the first, from the military school, the second from the academic world:

- Graduate students (minimum master's level);
- Officer cadets;
- Young graduates currently working or looking for a job.
